VACCINATION

Vaccination is the most effective way to avoid immunopreventable diseases (those which have vaccine available) to happen.


Brazil is a world reference in vaccination and the Sistema Único de Saúde - SUS (Unified Health System) offers the population free access to all the vaccines recommended by the World Health Organization - WHO. The vaccination room in the Unidades Básicas de Saúde - UBS (Basic Health Units) works from Monday to Friday. On Saturdays, vaccines are available in the UBS Integradas.

There are vaccines for children, adults, the elderly and pregnant women and they work if they are done on time and with correct doses, at all ages, also avoiding the return of a disease.

The public health system provides about 17 vaccines that compose the Vaccine Schedule, helping to prevent more than 20 serious diseases that occur at different ages.

If you still have your vaccination card from your country, bring it along on the day you go to UBS.
